<b>5.</b>	<b>COUNTY COUNCIL AFFAIRS</b>	
	<p><b>The following report was presented by Cllr Stone:</b></p> <p><b>State of the Roads</b> County Highways have been completely overwhelmed by the weather. The roads are cracking up and there have been justified complaints about gritting. Not the fault of the gritting and maintenance teams who have been doing a tremendous job in difficult circumstances.</p> <p>A major contributory factor to the formation of potholes is the lack of re-surfacing work across the county. The Liberal Democrat budget proposed today, and roundly defeated, called for a substantially greater investment in road maintenance and road safety than the Conservative budget.</p> <p>It remains the fact that where roads have a decent surface they don't break up.</p> <p>Gritting and salting have been in the news. The whole gritting regime is to go before scrutiny in March to see what lessons can be learned.</p> <p><b>School transport</b> I have been involved in meetings with the County Council and a Fowlmere resident on the question of the cost of student rail tickets from Foxton. The cost of tickets has apparently risen by 170%.</p> <p>Elaine Holt, managing director of First Capital Connect is to attend a meeting at the Sheltered Housing Communal Room, Elin Way Meldreth, on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> March at 7:00 pm. There are undoubtedly residents of Fowlmere who are affected by recent and proposed rail changes, so perhaps a representative of the Parish Council might like to attend.</p> <p><b>Imperial War Museum</b> The Imperial War Museum is suffering badly from the economic downturn and expects its</p>	

	<p>government grants to be cut.</p> <p>The Museum is therefore considering any ways it can save money or boost income. There was nobody from Fowlmere at the last meeting of the Liaison Committee where the Museum enquired if parish council representatives would have any views on the Museum charging for Neighbours of Duxford passes. At present these are entirely free. Proposals ranged from half price entry to a single charge for the card and no entry fee. I should be glad to have any views.</p> <p><b>The Parish Council felt that any charge made to Neighbours of Duxford would result in loss of gift/refreshment revenue as people would probably not visit the airfield if they had to pay and entry fee.</b></p>	
5/A	<p><b>Other matters discussed with Cllr Stone:</b></p> <p>MB mentioned that there were serious problems in Rectory Lane with large vehicles damaging the walls in this narrow area and asked if signs could be erected to help minimise the damage.</p> <p>MB acknowledged the problem regarding the state of roads but stated that there were numerous deep potholes in the road along the Butts that needed urgent attention.</p> <p><b>Cllr Stone left the meeting at this point.</b></p>

MARY'S CHURCH on <b>10 February at 7.30 PM</b></p> <p>PRESENT: Cllr D Roberts, Cllr P Flynn, Cllr M Bates, Cllr B Hawkins, Cllr D Woods, Cllr W Kohler, Mrs J Fletcher (Clerk)</p> <p>IN ATTENDANCE: Five residents from the village</p> <p>APOLOGIES: Apologies were received from Cllr A Eades.</p> <p><b>1. Declarations of interest (if any)</b></p> <p>Before discussion, Cllr Roberts declared that if an application is later placed before South Cambridgeshire District Council she will approach any new information afresh.</p> <p><b>2. S/2135/08/O – Affordable Housing, off London Road – Chartism Housing Association</b></p> <p>The Parish Council felt that this is an inappropriate outline application and will ask for refusal. Residents and the Parish Council were very concerned regarding access on an already busy lane, (because of the village hall), which is on a bend with poor visibility in both directions and where traffic travels very quickly. Also, the meeting was very concerned that this development will only be fully confirmed at reserve matters stage.</p> <p>Cllr Roberts mentioned that again there had not been an approach by Chartism to the PC regarding their intentions. Cllr Roberts stated that the PC is working with their chosen housing association regarding two alternative sites not in the green belt and that this housing association is following all normal procedures.</p> <p>Right of way on the access is still in question and one part of the proposed site belongs to a resident who stated he would not be selling. There is also no mention of rented housing which is the type of accommodation a large number of young residents would require.</p> <p>Cllr Bates stated that residents should write individually to SCDC with their comments.</p> <p><b>Residents left the meeting at this point.</b></p>	

	<p><b>3. Tree Applications</b></p> <p><u>Under Chestnut, High Street</u> The meeting was concerned about an ancient tree such as a Yew being demolished and questioned if this could be trimmed back. The meeting agreed to abide by the decision of SCDC Tree Officer.</p> <p><b>4.
