CID Update

As you may have previously read in an Ecops message sent during the month, we're pleased to say between April 1, 2009 and March 31, 2010, crime was down 11%, equating to 2,947 crimes. Serious acquisitive crime (burglary dwelling, robbery and vehicle crime) was down 16%, all recorded violent crime with injury was down 4%, serious sexual offences were down nearly 25% and criminal damage was down nearly 19%

Distraction Burglary Information Leaflet

Distraction burglary is when criminals call at your house posing as officials or asking for your help with something. They make up a story to get into your home, and generally target older people. They have just one intention - to steal!

Operation Liberal who are funded by the Home Office and the Energy Retail Association, is a national police unit set up to help catch the criminals who carry out distraction burglaries and they have produced a useful leaflet about how you can recognise distraction burglary techniques and avoid falling victim to these criminals.
